The Department of Homeland Security awarded a Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) grant to the Wheat Ridge Fire Protection District. The grant will enable the District to increase public safety by hiring 11 certified firefighters in fiscal year 2011. SAFER grants will fund 100 percent of the salary and benefits for the firefighters spanning a two-year performance period. Revenue Share Report 2010

The City has participated in the Visa Revenue Share Program since 2007. This program offers monthly rebates on the total volume amount paid by using a Visa card.

In 2007 the total amount returned to the City was \$9,723.70. In 2010 the total amount back to the City was \$13,301.63. The Purchasing and Contracting Division researches various opportunities and trends for the City to increase the Revenue Share.

Colorado statewide task forces putting auto theft on lockdown

Together with law enforcement agencies, insurance companies and community partners, the newly formed Coloradans Against Auto Theft (CAAT) coalition is working to put the brakes on auto theft. Compared to 2005, they have reduced motor vehicle thefts by 60 percent and criminal trespasses to vehicles by 54 percent in 2010 in Wheat Ridge. However, a recent statewide poll shows that one in five Coloradans engage in risky behaviors such as not locking cars, leaving cars running, or parking in dimly lit areas.
