Wheat Ridge Recreation Center, 4005 Kipling Street



38th Avenue Corridor Plan Adopted

The Wheat Ridge City Council adopted the 38th Avenue Corridor Plan that establishes a vision for the revitalization of 38th Avenue between Wadsworth and Sheridan Boulevards which is a priority redevelopment area for the City. The plan lays the framework for creating a vibrant, economically- viable corridor, a portion of which will serve as the community's main street. Major recommendations include the creation of a corridor-wide marketing plan, land use and urban design strategies to attract private investment and redesigning the roadway to improve the pedestrian environment.



A key step in implementing the plan is the formation of a 38th Avenue Leadership Committee that will include business and property owners along the corridor. The involvement of businesses on the street is essential as the City proceeds with the revitalization of 38th Avenue. I look forward to creation of the Leadership Committee, which will play an important role in the plan's implementation. I also want to give thanks to all those that have participated so far and to those

who participated in the public comment portion of the Council meeting.

City to Hold First Ever Run-off Election

On Tuesday, December 13, 2011, the City of Wheat Ridge will hold its first ever run-off election for the position of City Clerk. As required by the City Charter, the positions of Clerk, Treasurer and Mayor are elected by a majority vote. This year's Clerk race drew the interest of four candidates. With none of the four candidates garnering the required majority vote, a run-off election is necessary. The two City Clerk candidates with the highest votes from the November 1st general election are eligible for the run-off election. Currently Janelle Shaver and Maureen Keller are the two leaders in the Clerk's race according to the official election results from Jefferson County. Run-off election policies and procedures may be found at www.ci.wheatridge.co.us/cityclerk. This is an all-mail election. All active and inactive voters will automatically receive a ballot. Voters may obtain replacement or absentee ballots at the Office of the Wheat Ridge City Clerk.



Once residents receive their ballot they should fill them out and return or mail them to the City Clerk's office at 7500 W. 29th Ave. All ballots must be received no later than 7 p.m. on December 13th. Staff, Election Commission members, and election judges will be on hand to ensure that the handling and counting of ballots is in accordance with the adopted rules and procedures concerning this run-off election.

Jefferson County Public Library Previews 2012 Hours of Operation



Jefferson County Public Library (JCPL) announced that it will implement new service hours in 2012. These and other changes will enable the Library to bring 2012 expenses in line with revenues and balance the Library's budget.

Beginning in 2012, all JCPL libraries, including Arvada, Belmar, Columbine, Conifer, Edgewater, Evergreen, Golden, Lakewood, Standley Lake and Wheat Ridge, will provide service on Mondays. (All Libraries have been closed in 2011 on Mondays) Outreach initiatives, including our Traveling Children's Library, Bookmobile, eTrain mobile computer training lab and Homebound Services, will operate on Mondays as well. Hours at all library locations will be changing as a result of budget reductions; however, the Online Library (jeffcolibrary.org) will remain open 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
